Election of officers and directors will be held at the October 6<sup>th</sup> meeting. Elections will be held for the offices of President and Secretary along with two board members for 2025. To be eligible to run for any Livestock Association position a person must have been a paid member of the Association in both 2023 and 2024. #### **Association Dues**

2025 Association dues of 25 cents are automatically collected from the check of any 4-H and FFA youth who exhibited and sold a market animal at the 2024 Garrett County Fair. Dues for other youth (18 years of age or younger) are 25 cents. Adult dues are \$5.00 per year, or \$30 for ten years. 2025 dues may be paid between August 1, 2024 and January 31, 2025. ## **Club Meeting Attendance Waiver**

The requirement for club meeting attendance for eligibility to sell a market animal at the 2025 Garrett County fair will be in effect for the coming year. For many years, the 4-H program and the Garrett County Livestock Association have outlined the expectations for young people who wish to earn the privilege of selling an animal at the fair. The livestock sale is extremely successful and offers members a chance to receive more money for their projects than would commonly be available in the regular market. Because of this advantage, we feel that it is important for members to demonstrate responsibility and show effort in their participation.

The two expectations that are required:

- 1. Completion of a record book with summaries for any animal that was tagged at the fall and/or spring weigh-ins.
- 2. Satisfactory club attendance: 4-H clubs holding 8 meetings or less, a member may miss only one meeting. 4-H clubs holding 9 or more meetings, a member may miss two meetings. FFA members must attend 75% of the meetings held.

The Garrett County Livestock Association allows a member to attend two make-up meetings. There are four opportunities that can count as a make-up meeting

- 1. Attendance at the fall GCLA meeting and picnic, held on October 6th
- 2. Attendance to help set up for Spring Weigh-in and District Show, held in early May, actual date and time will be communicated to all
- 3. Showing a market animal at the Western MD District Livestock Show
- 4. Fair clean-up and preparation (date to be announced)

Attendance for youth who sold an animal at the 2024 fair begins with the next meeting after the fair and continues until August 2025. Attendance for new youth who did not sell an animal begins in January 2025 when they enroll in a market livestock project.

## **Beef Fall Weigh-In**

Members planning to sell a steer at the 2025 Garrett County Fair must bring their steer to the fall weigh-in event. Reminder: We will only be having one weigh-in day.

Date: Saturday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> from 8:00 am until 2:00 pm.

**Location: Garrett County Fairgrounds** 

\*\*Families will be provided a registration link to select a weigh-in time to avoid long waiting lines.

In case of bad weather, cancellation announcements will be made on radio stations, WFRB and WKHJ. If the weigh-in needs to be rescheduled, the make-up date will be **Saturday**, **November 9**<sup>th</sup>.

At the weigh in: your animal will be weighed and tagged.

The Livestock Association will provide triangle nine immunizations, if needed. The Garrett County Livestock Association representatives who will be conducting the weigh-in understand that you have not had a lot of time to work with your animal. To have the weighing and tagging go as smoothly as possible please abide by the following guidelines:

There will be Livestock Association helpers at the scales who will help assist with your animal but your animal should be wearing a halter (this does not mean it is expected to be halter broken, the halter will be used for restraining purposes). Please try to work with your animal enough that it is comfortable with you and controllable. **Fall Weigh-In is a mandatory event for all youth with the market steer project.** Please share this information with anyone who may be planning to have a steer for the first time in 2025.

Livestock Registration Forms will be mailed out to all members that had a 2024 steer early September. Additional forms can be obtained from the 4-H Office. The registration link will be provided with the forms. #### County Bred Animals

The county bred card must be completed including the signature of the breeder. Please have the card completed when you arrive for weigh-in and tagging. Market Animals that are bred by a full-time County resident and born in Garrett County are eligible for competition in the County Bred program.

Animals purchased at the stockyard may be eligible for the county bred program if they were bred and born in Garrett County. The stockyard staff can provide you with the name and contact information to help you determine eligibility. Animals purchased from a producer outside of the county by a Garrett County resident and resold to a Garrett County 4-H or FFA member are not eligible for county bred program because they were not born in Garrett County.

Animals not declared as county bred at the time of tagging will not be eligible for the county bred program at the 2025 Garrett County Fair.

## \*\*\*\* RFID Tag Requirement for 2025 Market Steers\*\*\*\*

All swine and cattle including steers must have a Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) tag. Steers should be tagged by the producer. If the steer that you purchased does not have an RFID tag, you may obtain one through a veterinarian. All steers will need an RFID tag prior to the November 4<sup>th</sup> weigh-in. RFID tags will not be supplied at weigh-in.

Producers needing RFID tags will need their premise identification number and can call (410-841-5810) and purchase through a USDA approved manufacturer.
