Demonstrations were presented by the following club members:

- Savannah Pierce- How to Care for Oregano. This demo taught club members how to plant and care for oregano as well as how to preserve it for future use and enter it in the county fair. Fresh and dried oregano were available to view as an example.
- Emma Smith- Archery Scoring. This demo taught club members about the different scoring systems/ types of targets used for archery.
- Waylon Starling- Air Rifle Safety. This demo taught club members the different rules and methods needed for practicing air rifle safely. A poster board was available for visual cues for the different safety rules.

- Cali Stonesifer- Benefits of Microgreens. This demo taught club members how to grow microgreens and ways that eating microgreens can benefit the human body. A poster board was available for visual cues for all the benefits and club members were given their own bowls, soils, and seeds to plant their microgreens and take them home so they can try them once they have grown.
- Savannah Pierce- Homemade Sugar Scrub. This demo taught club members how to save money or make gifts for others by making their own sugar scrubs at home. Club members were given ingredients and containers and made their scrubs while following along with Savannah's demonstration.
- Savannah Pierce- Mason Jar Lid Christmas Ornaments. This demo taught club members one idea for recycle crafts and used a mason jar ring, jute twine, and decorations to make a rustic Christmas ornament. Club members were given their materials and followed along with Savannah's instructions.
- Waylon Starling- STEM. This demonstration showed club members how he made a white fox out of foam sheets by using a computer/printer to make a model and then cut it out for his STEM project.
- Cali Stonesifer- Painting with Bubbles. This demo taught club members how to use watered down craft paint in a cup or small container and straws to blow bubbles into the paint and then use those bubbles to press onto a piece of paper and make cool painted designs.
- Emma Smith- Walking Desserts. This demo taught club members how to make walking desserts (same concept as walking tacos) as a fun thing to do camping. There were four different dessert options available and each club member picked out their necessary ingredients and then followed along with Emma's instructions for how to assemble them. Once complete everyone was able to walk with their dessert up to the grill to watch the next demonstration.
- Kayla Wilson- How to Grill Chicken Breast. This demo taught club members how to prepare and marinate chicken and then cook it on the grill. Kayla discussed the proper handling of chicken and the correct temperature to cook it to. Once the chicken was finished, it was put out for a snack.
