High Tunnel Construction Workshops



High tunnels are used by many vegetable farmers to extend the growing season. A high tunnel is a greenhouse-like structure that allows producers to start planting earlier in the spring and grow later into the fall. These structures are very beneficial in Garrett County with our colder climate and short growing season. Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) has funding available

through EQIP to purchase and construct tunnels. The funding will cover the cost of the tunnel and construction cost. Farmers can construct their own tunnels at a considerable cost savings. In April, University of Maryland offered a hands-on high tunnel construction workshop. Attendees learned about the basic parts and construction of a high tunnel with both classroom and hands on high tunnel construction. A second high tunnel construction workshop is being planned for late

July. Even if you don't think you would build your own tunnel, the workshops are valuable for planning, learning about the construction and future maintenance of the structure.

No-Till Vegetable Field Event



University of Maryland Extension and Garrett Growers Cooperative will hold a No-till Vegetable meeting on June 19th at 5pm at the farm of Aaron Lantz at 8602 Gorman Road in Oakland. Garrett Growers Cooperative was awarded a Healthy Soils Grant by the Maryland Department of Agriculture in 2023. The coop used the funds to purchase no-till and cover crop equipment sized for small scale vegetable producers. At the event you will be able to see the equipment first hand and view pumpkins and sweetcorn planted into a crop of rolled down cereal rye. We are hoping to demonstrate planting with the no-till planter if the weather permits.

No-Till Drill & Lime Spreader Available for Rent



Farmers planting 10 or more acres of cover crops in 2024/2025 may qualify for payments to help cover the costs. Payments can be used to help cover costs associated with seeds, equipment and labor. Sign up is only once per year. The exact date for this year has not yet been announced but it will be around the end of

The Garrett Soil Conservation District has a No-Till Drill and a Lime Spreader available for rent to area farmers. Farmers do not have to live in Garrett County in order to rent the equipment. Cost to rent the Drill is \$10 per acre. The Lime Spreader is \$3 per ton. It should be noted that the Lime Spreader cannot be used to spread poultry litter. The drill is a John Deere 1590 and will require a minimum 85 PTO horsepower tractor to pull. Please call the Garrett Soil Conservation District at 301-501-5886 to be added to the list.
